

what size table?

The size of the room can significantly impact the quality of play. Ideally, you want enough space around the table to comfortably use a full-length cue, which is typically 57-58 inches. However, if space is limited, you should at least have enough room to use a 52-inch cue, though a full-length cue is preferable. In such cases, a smaller table, like a 6-foot or 7-foot table, might be more practical.

These sizes are often used in homes and can still provide a great playing experience without requiring as much space as a standard 8-foot or 9-foot table. Additionally, consider the layout of the room and any furniture or obstacles that could interfere with play.
